pastor's corner

"Then Jesus said, Neither do I condemn you. Go – and from now on, do not sin anymore."

My sisters and brothers, these are the words that Jesus speaks to the adulteress in today's gospel, but truly, they are words for us all. This is a journey that we share together. As we traverse these 40 days that lead to Jerusalem, this 5th Sunday is an oasis in the desert – a time to ask how we are weathering through this season's prayer and sacrifice. What has this journey revealed to you? In my experience over these years, it has brought a variety of things... the difference between wanting and needing, and what can just be let go... the realization, in slowing down, that I am not so incredible as I thought I was... facing who I have not forgiven... learning a new love for myself and others... the fear and despair when it seems that God has gone away... or the realization that it was I who went away, and that God's sustenance of you and me is total, constant, and unconditional. Let us continue our journey together, as we head for Jerusalem and Palm Sunday next weekend.

The Palm Sunday weekend has a number of waypoints for our journey. On this coming Saturday, March 27th, we will have our annual Seder Dinner at 6:30 p.m. in the Auditorium. The liturgies of this weekend mark the beginning of Holy Week, and our Communal Liturgy of Reconciliation will be held on Tuesday, March 30th, at 7:30 p.m. in the Church. A number of opportunities are available for confession through the week. See the Administration column to the right.

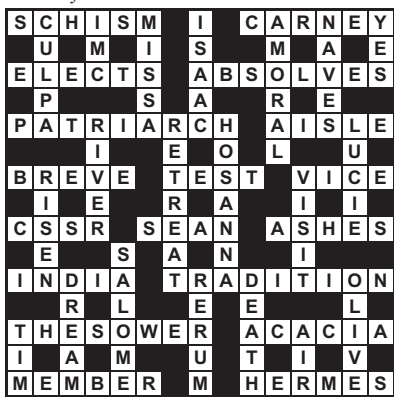

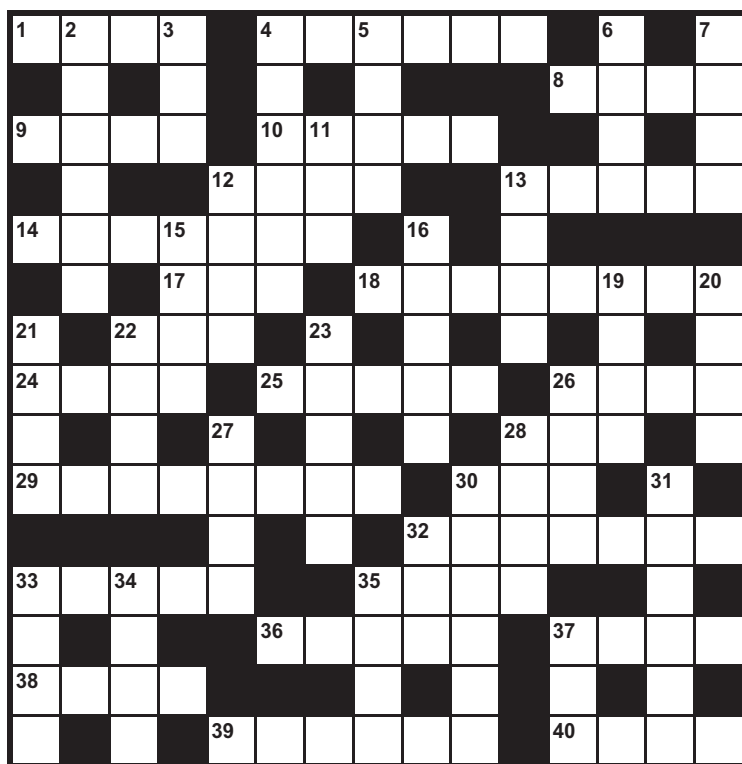
