MARRIAGE INFORMATION NIGHT

Those wishing to be married at St. Monica (or prepared here for a wedding elsewhere) are invited to attend this meeting. Attending one of the monthly Marriage Information Nights is the first step in marriage preparation before any specific wedding arrangements can be made. Wednesday, April 21st, is the date for this month's session; next month it will be held on Wednesday, May 26th.

EASTER VESPERS

In the ancient church, during the traditional Easter vespers (evening prayer), the newly baptized were taken in procession to the font, from whose sacred waters they had risen on Holy Saturday night, as Christ from the tomb. They came forth cleansed from their sins, radiant with light and immortality.

The paschal candle would be taken from its marble column and carried at the head of the procession. Closely after it followed a deacon carrying a silver vial of holy chrism. Next came the cross and seven acolytes carrying seven torches, symbolic of the heavenly vision described in the Apocalypse. The sacred ministers advanced under the guidance of the holy standard, and after them, the bishop. Immediately after came the newly baptized (now called neophytes), walking two by two, and attracting all eyes by their recollected demeanor and the beauty of their robes. The rest of the faithful closed the procession. *(4th century account)*

CORRECTION TO STATIONS OF THE CROSS

In the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, in Station 11, it was erroneously stated that "the funeral of Marine Lance Corporal Matthew Snyder was protested" by a group of Christians claiming that he was a gay man. In fact, his funeral was protested by a fractious Christian group claiming that the death of American soldiers is a result of "this nation's tolerance for gay people" and "has resulted in punishment, especially the deaths of American soldiers." We sincerely regret this factual error.

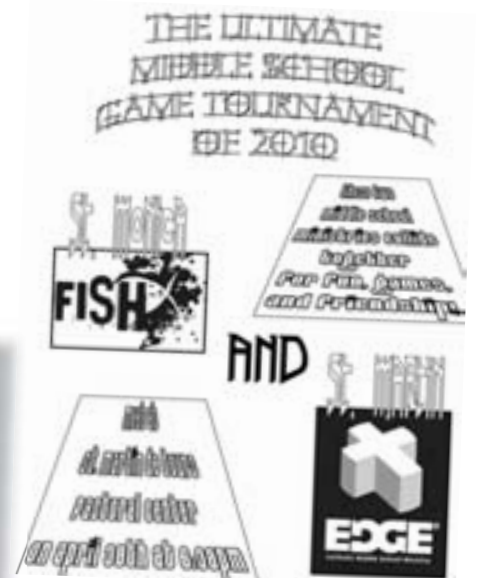

Before I knew it Saint Nick arrived and our day was coming to an end. The children were undoubtedly satisfied with the gifts the people from St. Monica had donated. Their eyes went wide as they tore open the packages to find something brand new just for them! It was such an amazing experience to see them so happy. I underestimated how much a simple hug, gift, or an ear to listen can impact a child in need.

As we packed up and got ready to return



home, we were left with hugs and kisses as if the children and caretakers had known us a lifetime. They were so excited to have us visit and anticipated our next return. On the bus ride back, I reflected on how grateful I was to be a part of this tremendous trip that St. Monica parish makes

possible. I've never actually attended a Mass at St. Monica and yet felt so comfortable with the parishioners. I'm fortunate to have met such an active parish and to be a witness of all the good they do in the community – even those in other countries. I'm just as eager as the children to return to El Hogar and look forward to making many more of these memories.

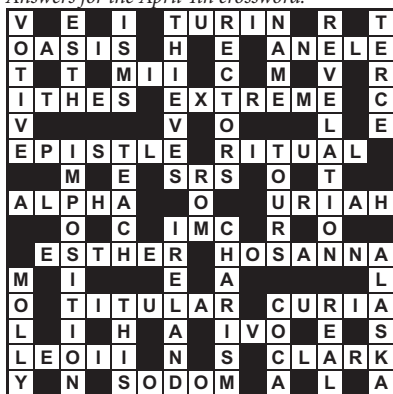

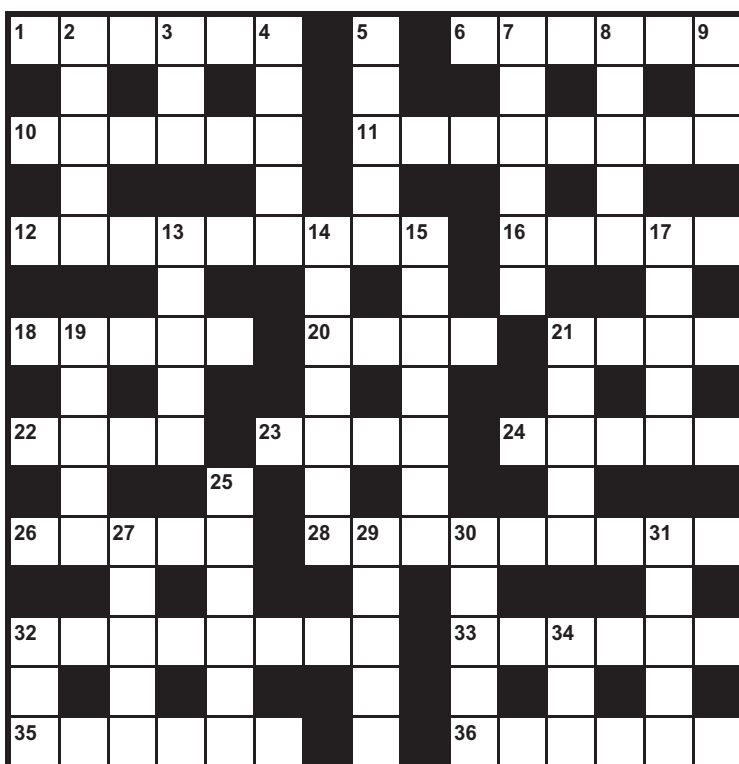
