INITIATION--THE NEOPHYTES, THE NEWLY CONFIRMED, THE FIRST COMMUNICANTS

According to a custom that is as old as the human race, a sign carried on the forehead is a sign of belonging. Slaves, especially, often had such a sign branded on their foreheads (or arms); it told others who their owner was. In the sacrament of Baptism Jesus who suffered and died and conquered on the Cross takes possession of the children whom their parents have brought to him. The children will belong to him not as slaves used to belong to their masters, but they will belong to Christ the way lovers belong to each other. (Balthasar Fischer) Infants are signed with the Cross at their welcoming, and marked again with the Cross after Baptism with the Sacred Chrism. In a like fashion, those newly Confirmed last Sunday bore on their foreheads the sign, seal and fragrant oil as a mark of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Our First Communicants the past two Saturdays have come in their white robes (reminiscent of their Baptism), to be initiated into the Sacred Meal which is Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ. Through our celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation this Easter Season, our community is strengthened in faith, hope, and love. Lift all our newly initiated to the Lord in your prayer this season.

HOUSE CHURCHES IN THE FIRST CENTURY

During these Easter weeks both on Sundays and at daily Mass we hear about the spread of the Christian message and the growth of the early Church. In the first centuries, the community gathered in the private homes of Christians. The Acts of the Apostles chronicles some of the story of how the Christian message was planted like seeds in the many communities of Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) and Greece. A private house in Dura-Europos in Iraq was excavated in the early part of the last century, and it is thought to have been used as a Christian meeting place in the early third century. The building consists of a house joined to a separate "hall-like room" which functioned as a meeting room for the Church. The surviving frescoes of the baptistry are probably some of the most ancient extant Christian paintings. Jesus as "Good Shepherd" is represented as well as the healing of the paralytic and Christ and Peter walking on the water. These earliest surviving depictions of Jesus found anywhere from the ancient Christian world date back to approximately 235 AD.

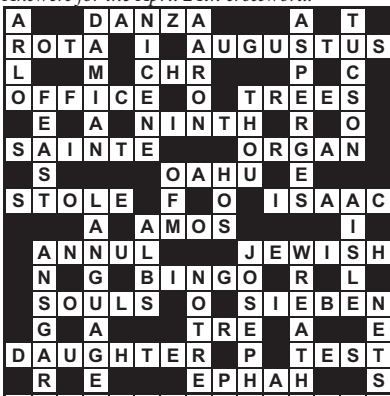

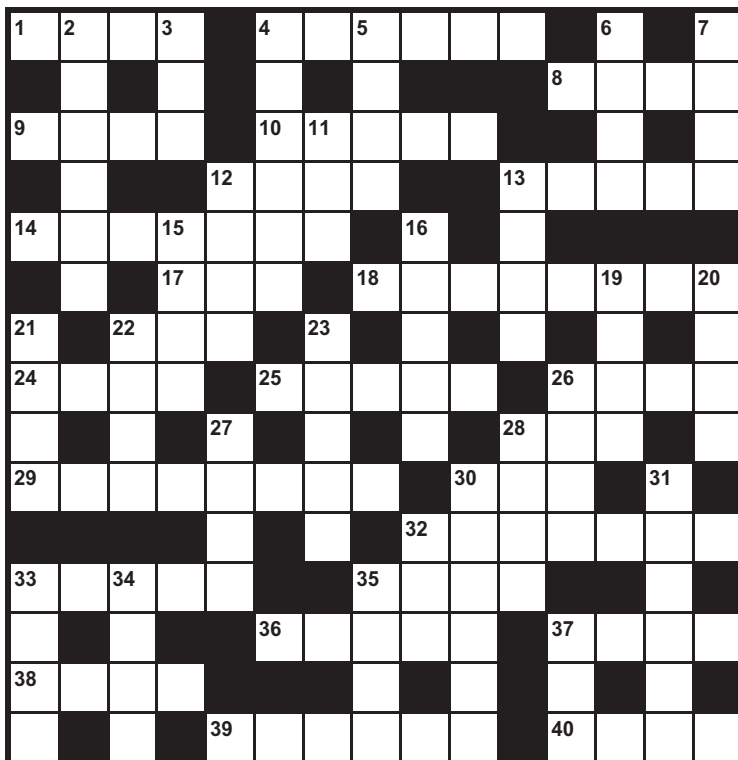
