During the Church year there are a variety of special collections for various causes, concerns and needs. The number and variety of these appeals can sometimes make the process cumbersome. In an effort to simplify the process we have consolidated eight of those collections into a single appeal the weekend of May 15 & 16. You are invited to support any or all of these worthy causes. Please find below a description of each:

#### NATIONAL NEEDS CAMPAIGN

Funds a wide range of pastoral services, including evangelization, religious education, the maintenance of mission parishes, the training of seminarians and lay ministers, and ministry to ethnic groups.

#### CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES COLLECTION (CRS COLLECTION)

Supports agencies that build the international social ministry of the Catholic Church through advocacy on behalf of the powerless and impoverished people including relief and resettlement services to victims of natural disasters, war, and religious and ethnic persecution.

#### CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT (CCHD)

"Addresses the root causes of poverty in America through promotion and support of community-controlled, self-help organizations and transformative education."

#### CARDINAL MCINTYRE FUND

Provides food, shelter, and one-time assistance to families in crises: such as assistance with medical or funeral expenses for families in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

#### PRIEST RETIREMENT FUND

Currently 153 priests in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles are retired and receiving retirement benefits from the Priest Pension Fund. Over the coming ten years, an additional 207 priests—who are actively serving in the Archdiocese today – will turn 65 years of age or be newly retired.

#### PETER'S PENCE (COLLECTION FOR THE HOLY FATHER)

Enables the Holy Father to respond with emergency financial assistance to requests for aid to the neediest throughout the world – those who suffer as a result of war, oppression, and natural disasters.

#### RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS (RFR)

Provides present and future retirement needs of the elderly members (religious sisters, brothers, and religious order priests) of the over 500 religious institutes in the United States. Today, nearly 60,000 religious men and women are over the age of 60.

#### PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH-WORLD MISSION

## PRAYING WITH OPEN HANDS

On praying with open, outstretched hands: On one occasion I gained new insight into this ancient gesture, when I read somewhere that the Assyrians had a word for prayer which meant "to open the fist." The fist, and especially a fist raised threateningly, is the sign of a highhanded, even violent person. People grasp things in closed hands when they are unwilling to let go of them; they use clenched fists to assault and hurt and, even worse, to beat others down so that they cannot get up. Those who pray, however, are saying before God that they are renouncing all highhandedness, all pride in their own sufficiency, all violence. They open their fists. They hold up their empty hands to God: "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy. For I myself am dependent on him who fills my empty hands with his gifts."

We invite you to share a special meal with us on Sunday, May 23rd, 2010 from 7 - 8:30 pm in the Pastoral Conference Room. 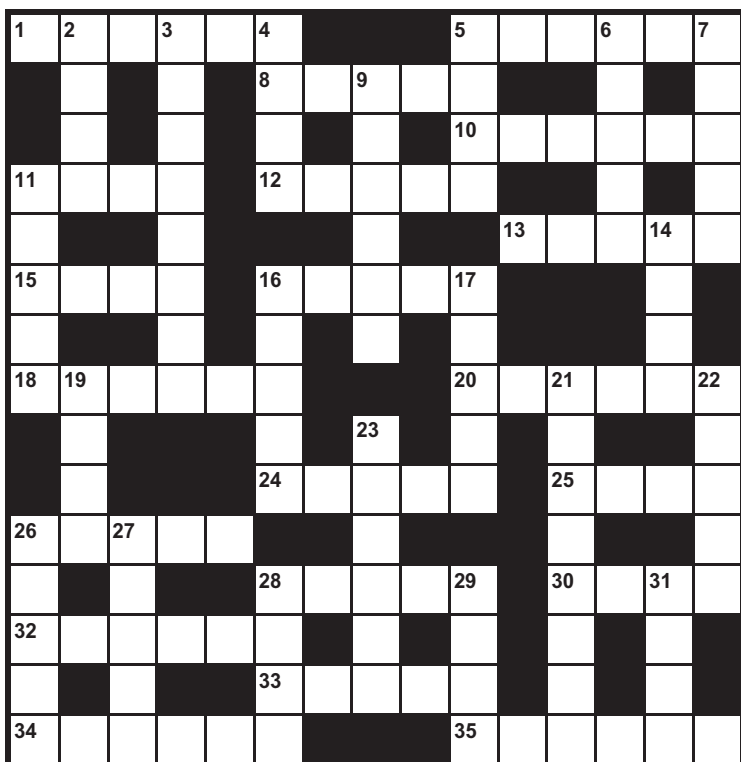
