TRINITY SUNDAY

Today is the first of the three doctrinal feasts celebrated after Pentecost, which commemorate not a person but a theological tenet, doctrine, or devotion. Today's solemnity celebrates the doctrine of the Triune God, one God in three divine persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

In the fourth century, the Church underwent a serious crisis when Arius, a priest of Alexandria, denied the divinity of Christ, and as a consequence, faith in the Trinity and the equality of the three divine Persons. This heresy, called Arianism, was condemned by the councils of Nicaea (325) and Constantinople (381). The result was the formulation of the Creed that we recite at Mass today. This creed has been used for close to 1,700 years.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, notice how frequently we articulate our belief in the Trinity: with the Sign of the Cross, the Doxology at the end of the presidential prayers, the Gloria, the Profession of Faith, and the Eucharistic Prayer culminating in the Great Doxology above, and finally with the Solemn Blessing at the end of Mass. WHAT JUST FAITH MEANT TO ME!

Just Faith is an intensive and successful model of justice education and spiritual formation. We were exposed not only to a substantive and demanding course of study but afforded the privilege of becoming community with each other and sharing a journey of faith and compassion that is both life-giving and challenging.

I originally signed up for the 33-week course, hungering for a deeper relationship with God. At the end of the program, it did not meet my expectations at all, IT EXCEEDED IT. How could a 9-month commitment for several hours a week open me up to a deeper relationship with Jesus? It was all about choice. I had to choose to put my comfortable and cozy faith into action. I kept shaking my head saying, "I paid to be this uncomfortable?" Putting a face on poverty and injustice is not easy, but essential. Our immersion projects took us to the prisons...to the streets of the poor and marginalized...to the homeless in our backyard and the Garden School Foundation project in central LA.

This is a life-transforming course. "There is a way for us to live justly in the world with each other," said Vivian. "We have formed relationships with others who are influencing each other in a positive way," said Dennis. Ann felt it was a "wake up call for her. Good intentions are great, but we need to be more connected with our community." She is looking forward to putting what she learned to practice. Rebecca commented, "this course makes the "big" church a small community." Ed enjoyed it so much, "learning and sharing with people of their traditions, culture and family." Jose "found a greater understanding of Catholic Social Justice teaching and learned to see the issues of justice through another person's eyes."

My habits have been forever altered and a new me has emerged. I am community with St. Monica and the world and I am blessed on this journey.

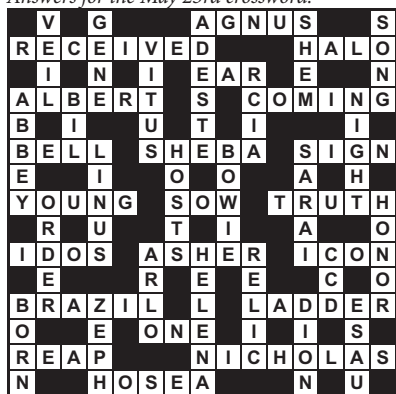

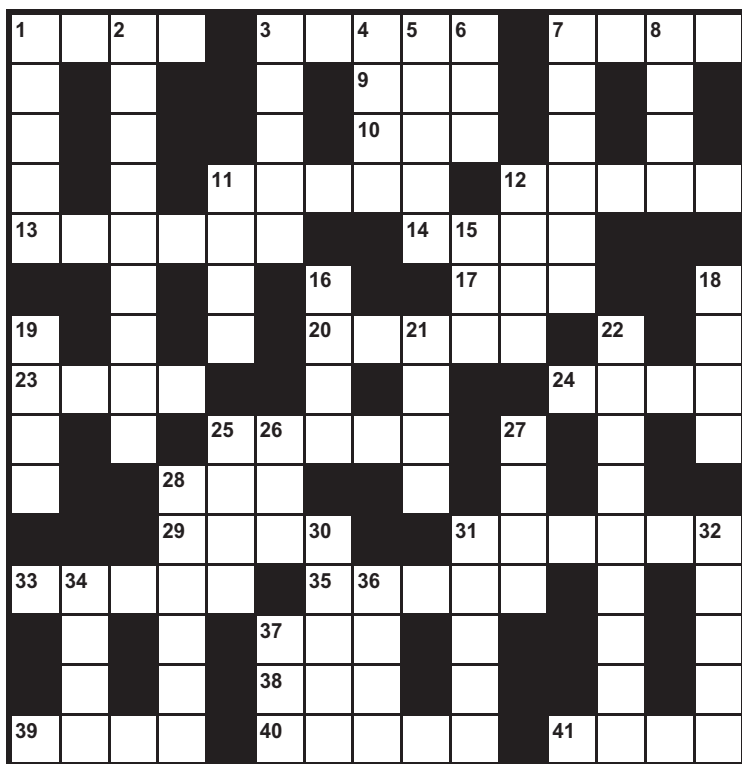
